## The Hero Among Us!!

An appreciation of a neighbor, by a classmate and friend.

ero. The word "hero" has lost much of its impact these days due to over-usage in sports and many other areas. During the

Second World War many county residents served in combat but sadly, most of them are gone now. The war that most of us remember today, and the one that resulted in more than 58,000 U.S. casualties, was fought in Vietnam.

The combat hero I refer to served two tours there and lives quietly among us today in Camas County.

Gary Jewett grew up and attended school here, played first string on the football team as a tough 120 lb. guard, and graduated in 1960.

When he joined the U.S. Army they decided that he would be a good helicopter pilot. He was trained to fly the Bell UH-1 "Huey" helicopter, whose "whop—whop—whop" sound of its rotor blades provided the sound track of the war to our combat soldiers in Vietnam.

He would never make a big deal of his experiences there, but we should be aware of, and appreciate, his outstanding service to our country.

Gary was assigned to the 1st Air Cavalry flying combat assault missions, often landing under fire to insert our troops into jungle clearings. He also often flew into "hot landing zones" under fire to resupply the troops with ammunition and supplies, and fly out the wounded.

During two 12 month tours in Vietnam Gary flew "well over 1,000 hours of combat flying" when it wasn't unusual to fly 10 to 12 hours a day,

according to his fellow pilot, Jim Lawton.

Gary was shot down on one occasion over along the Ho Chi Minh Trail where he evaded capture in the jungle for hours, with enemy troops nearby looking for him, until he was finally rescued. He had to crash land on a number of other occasions due to his

helicopter being so shot up that it would no longer

The Distinguished Flying Cross is a military decoration awarded to any officer or enlisted member of the United States Armed Forces "who distinguishes himself in support operations by heroism or extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight."

Gary was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross on three different occasions. Regrettably, in every instance one or more of his crewmembers was killed.

Later Gary flew Huey gunships. He says he liked flying the gunships better because he was the one doing the shooting, instead of just being shot at. After the end of the war he went on to fly Cobra and Apache attack helicopters during his military career.

I think we can all be proud to have a man like this as our neighbor and friend. ♥



# THE MONTH OF MAY IN AUTOMOTIVE HISTORY

## May 2, 1918: GM buys Chevrolet

On May 2nd, over 100 years ago, GM became the world's largest automotive firm and proceeded to buy out Chevrolet. It was no secret that Chevrolet had been struggling in prior years. So in the year 1910, after GM had already bought other larger corporations, it came as no surprise that they then purchased Chevrolet.

## May 11, 1947: Invention of the tubeless tire

On May 11th, 1947, B.F Goodrich of Ohio created the innovative tubeless tire. This invention is known to have made vehicles both safer and more efficient. After undergoing rigorous testing and statewide adoption, Goodrich gained a patent for the tubeless tire five years later. This initial design was later expanded on by Michelin and is now considered to be the standard for tires.

## May 16th, 1956: General Motors Technical Center

On May 16th, 1956 General Motors dedicated what would be half a billion dollars in today's currency to build the GM Technical Center in Warren, Michigan. This center is one of a kind, and one of the largest in the world covering 600 acres.

## May 7, 1998: Daimler-Benz buys Chrysler

May 7th, 1998, saw yet another automotive buyout. German company Daimler-Benz, yes the company that is famed for its creation of the luxurious Mercedes Benz, bought out Chrysler. This purchase has been regarded as one of the largest – if not the largest – foreign purchases in United States history.

## May 17th, 2005: Toyota introduces hybrid Camry

Hybrid cars aren't an innovation of the 2010s. On May 17th, in 2005, Toyota introduces a gas-electric hybrid version of the Camry. This hybrid would eventually go on to be the


